RE: Changes to NC Adjuster Licensing Process

Agent Services Division announces changes to the adjuster license process effective January 1, 2011.

Company/Independent Adjuster

- Individuals applying for a company/independent adjuster license will pay a total amount of \$125.00 for the \$50.00 registration fee and the \$75.00 license fee.
- The annual license fee of \$75.00 is due on or before April 1 each year. Agent Services will send a payment notice via *e-mail to the individual adjuster requiring the adjuster to make the annual payment via NIPR. Companies may use an authorized NIPR business partner and pay the annual fee for their employed adjusters.

Hail Adjuster

- Individuals applying for a hail adjuster license will pay a total amount of \$70.00 for the \$50.00 registration fee and the \$20.00 license fee.
- The annual license fee of \$20.00 is due on or before April 1 each year. Agent Services will send a payment notice via *e-mail to the individual adjuster requiring the adjuster to make the annual payment via NIPR. Companies may use an authorized NIPR business partner and pay the annual fee for their employed adjusters.

Applicable to both Company/Independent and Hail Adjusters

- Licenses will lapse for adjusters who fail to pay the annual license fee.
- In the past, Agent Services collected the annual license fee through a quarterly and annual company billing to an adjusting company. We will no longer bill companies in this manner for adjuster licenses processed after January 1, 2011.
- There will be one final quarterly billing sent in January 2011 for adjuster license fees and terminations processed from October 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010.
- As of January 1, 2011, the current ASD procedures for Appointment and Termination Form will be eliminated.
