Summary of Benefits

This booklet gives you a summary of what we cover and what you pay. It doesn't list every service that we cover or list every limitation or exclusion. To get a complete list of services we cover, call us and ask for the "Evidence of Coverage."

You have choices about how to get your Medicare benefits

- One choice is to get your Medicare benefits through Original Medicare (fee-for-service Medicare). Original Medicare is run directly by the Federal government.
- Another choice is to get your Medicare benefits by joining a Medicare health plan (such as **UnitedHealthcare MedicareDirect Rx (PFFS)**). A Private Fee-for-Service plan is not Medicare supplement insurance. Providers who do not contract with our plan are not required to see you except in an emergency.

Who can join?

To join UnitedHealthcare MedicareDirect Rx (PFFS), you must be entitled to Medicare Part A, be enrolled in Medicare Part B, and live in our service area.

Which doctors, hospitals, and pharmacies can I use?

You can go to any doctor, hospital, or other provider that accepts the plan's terms and conditions for payment and agrees to treat you. However, the provider can decide at every visit whether or not to accept the plan and treat you.

You must generally use network pharmacies to fill your prescriptions for covered Part D drugs.

Some of our network pharmacies have preferred cost-sharing. You may pay less if you use these pharmacies.

What do we cover?

Our plan members get all of the benefits covered by Original Medicare. For some of these benefits, you may pay more in our plan than you would in Original Medicare. For others, you may pay less.

We cover Part D drugs. In addition, we cover Part B drugs such as chemotherapy and some drugs administered by your provider.

How will I determine my drug costs?

Our plan groups each medication into one of five "tiers." You will need to use your formulary to locate what tier your drug is on to determine how much it will cost you. The amount you pay depends on the drug's tier and what stage of the benefit you have reached. Later in this document we discuss the benefit stages that occur after you meet your deductible: Initial Coverage, Coverage Gap, and Catastrophic Coverage.

Summary of Benefits

January 1, 2016 - December 31, 2016

Monthly Premium, Deductible, and Limits on How Much You Pay for Covered Services

How much is the monthly premium?	\$50 per month. In addition, you must keep paying your Medicare Part B premium.
How much is the deductible?	\$270 per year for Part D prescription drugs except for drugs listed on Tier 1 and Tier 2 which are excluded from the deductible.
Is there any limit on how much I will pay for my covered services?	<p>Yes. Like all Medicare health plans, our plan protects you by having yearly limits on your out-of-pocket costs for medical and hospital care.</p> <p>Your yearly limit(s) in this plan:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• \$6,700 for services you receive from any provider. <p>If you reach the limit on out-of-pocket costs, you keep getting covered hospital and medical services and we will pay the full cost for the rest of the year.</p> <p>Please note that you will still need to pay your monthly premiums and cost-sharing for your Part D prescription drugs.</p>
Is there a limit on how much the plan will pay?	No. There are no limits on how much our plan will pay.

Initial Coverage After you pay your yearly deductible, you pay the following until your total yearly drug costs reach \$3,310. Total yearly drug costs are the total drug costs paid by both you and our Part D plan.

You may get your drugs at network retail pharmacies and mail order pharmacies.

If you reside in a long-term care facility, you pay the same as at a retail pharmacy.

You may get drugs from an out-of-network pharmacy, but may pay more than you pay at an in-network pharmacy.

There is no deductible for Tier 1 and Tier 2 drugs. The deductible applies to drugs on Tier 3, Tier 4, and Tier 5.

Coverage Gap

Most Medicare drug plans have a coverage gap (also called the "donut hole"). This means that there's a temporary change in what you will pay for your drugs. The coverage gap begins after the total yearly drug cost (including what our plan has paid and what you have paid) reaches \$3,310.

After you enter the coverage gap, you pay 45% of the plan's cost for covered brand name drugs and 58% of the plan's cost for covered generic drugs until your costs total \$4,850, which is the end of the coverage gap. Not everyone will enter the coverage gap.

Catastrophic Coverage

After your yearly out-of-pocket drug costs (including drugs purchased through your retail pharmacy and through mail order) reach \$4,850, you pay the greater of:

- 5% of the cost, or
 - \$2.95 copay for generic (including brand drugs treated as generic) and a \$7.40 copayment for all other drugs.
